Board of Library Trustees Sworn in for New Terms



Largo, MD – The Prince George's County Memorial Library System (PGCMLS) Board of Library Trustees assumed new terms after the recent swearing-in ceremony. Three trustees are new to the Board: Dr. Arthuree R. M. Wright, Brett Crawford and Toni A. Smith. The biographies of our Board of Library Trustees and their respective terms follow.



Alease J. "Christy" Wright, President Term: 2016-2021

A Board of Library Trustees member since June 2008, Dr. Wright was elected President in January 2016. This former librarian is also a board member of the Maryland Advisory Council on Libraries, a charter board member of the National

Forum on Information Literacy and founder of the Literary Ladies Book Club. An alumna of Morgan State University (B.S. and Ed.D.) and the University of Maryland (M.L.S.), Wright retired from IBM in 2000 after a successful career in programming and technical marketing. She resides in Springdale, MD.



Samuel A. Epps IV, Vice President Term: 2016-2019

Samuel Epps serves as the Political Director for UNITE HERE Local 25, a union of 6,500 hotel workers in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. Responsibilities include policy, legislation and electoral politics. His past experience is in the areas of

nonprofit work, state government and campaign management. Epps is a former member of Prince George's Democratic Central Committee from District 21. He currently serves as President of the Trustees at the First Baptist Church of North Brentwood, MD. Epps has a bachelor's degree in Political Science from Penn State University. He and his wife, Zabrina reside in Laurel, MD.



Sylvia Bolivar Term: 2016-2021

Sylvia Bolivar, a member of the Board of Library Trustees since June 2008, served as President from February 2013 to January 2016. As a President Obama appointee to Senior Advisor for Placed-Based Initiatives at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Bolivar leads the Communications and

Stakeholder Engagement for the Promise Zones Initiative, in which the federal government partners with local communities and businesses to create jobs, expand educational opportunities, increase access to quality, affordable housing and improve public safety. She was Team Co-Lead of the OPM Agency Review Team for Obama's Presidential Transition Team. In November 2015, Sylvia Bolivar was an honoree at the first annual Latinas Empowering Prince George's County Award for her leadership and advocacy in education. She resides in College Park, MD and can be found on weekends at the library with her young son.



Arthuree R. M. Wright Term: 2016-2017

Dr. Arthuree McLaughlin Wright served 15 years as Associate Director of Information Services and two years as Interim Director of Libraries at Howard University prior to her retirement in May 2015. At Howard University, Wright focused on information literacy, assessment of learning and service effectiveness.

Nationally, she chaired the Research Committee of the Association of College and Research Libraries and served on the American Library Association's Committee on Accreditation. Her distinguished career began at the Science Library at MIT in Cambridge after earning a bachelor's degree in mathematics at Indiana University and the M.L.S. at Rutgers University. While at MIT, Wright was chair of the Board of Directors for the Cambridge YWCA. Subsequently, she earned a doctorate in library and information science from the University of Maryland. From 2004-2012, Arthuree McLaughlin Wright chaired the Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry for the Baltimore Washington Conference (BWC) of the United Methodist Church. Prior to that appointment, Wright chaired the BWC Task Force on Children and Poverty. Wright and her husband, Obie, a retired Methodist pastor, reside in Bowie, MD.



Brett Crawford Term: 2016 - 2019

Brett Crawford heads a management consulting firm focused on strategy, governance and innovation in the nonprofit and emerging businesses sectors. He has extensive experience promoting small business development, community

development and education policy. Crawford served as Louisiana's Secretary of Revenue, responsible for the state's tax policy and administration. He also held the position of Executive Director of the Louisiana Economic Development Corporation. Brett Crawford currently chairs the Board of Directors of Volunteers of America Chesapeake and is an advisor on strategic partnership and collaboration issues for Compass. Brett has a law degree from Georgetown

University Law Center, a Master of Business Administration from Dartmouth College and a bachelor's degree from Louisiana State University. He resides in Clinton, MD.



Toni A. Smith Term: 2016 - 2018

Toni Smith is the founder and executive director of In Reach, Inc. a nonprofit organization that prepares Prince George's County students for college, work and life. Smith has a long-standing commitment to children's issues and has worked in a variety of local and national youth advocacy nonprofit environments including The

Forum for Youth Investment and the Department of Pediatrics at Howard University Hospital. Toni Smith has written numerous articles that have been published nationally and internationally. She is passionate about improving the lives of children and youth, empowering women and girls to reach their full potential, and supporting the vital work of community-based nonprofit organizations. As a Library Trustee for PGCMLS, Smith believes that enriching, engaging and illuminating the lives of others is absolutely achievable. She resides in Landover, Maryland.
