County Library's Wilfong Architectural Photos Now Available through Digital Maryland

Hyattsville, MD – The Maryland Room of the Hyattsville Branch Library is the proud curator of the *James Chester Wilfong, Jr. Architectural Photographs Collection*. The collection is now digitized and available through <u>Digital Maryland</u>. The collection includes 169 photos of old houses, slave quarters, taverns, a hospital, churches, mansions and other dwellings built between the early 17th and mid-20th centuries. Photographer James Wilfong is believed to have taken the photographs between 1921 and 1987. Wilfong's fascination with old houses, not only included photography, but regular columns in the *New York Times* and *Washington Post* on the subject.
